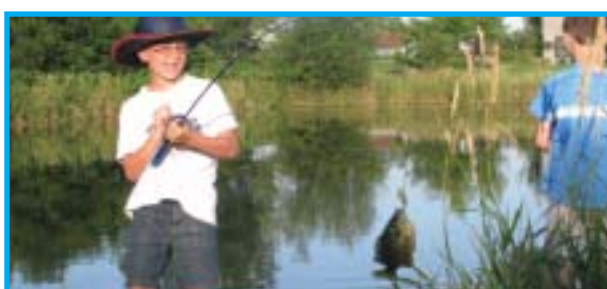

- * **Appanoose Builders Camp** – Learn the basics of building while constructing a building from the ground up. Lots of fun. Great learning experience.

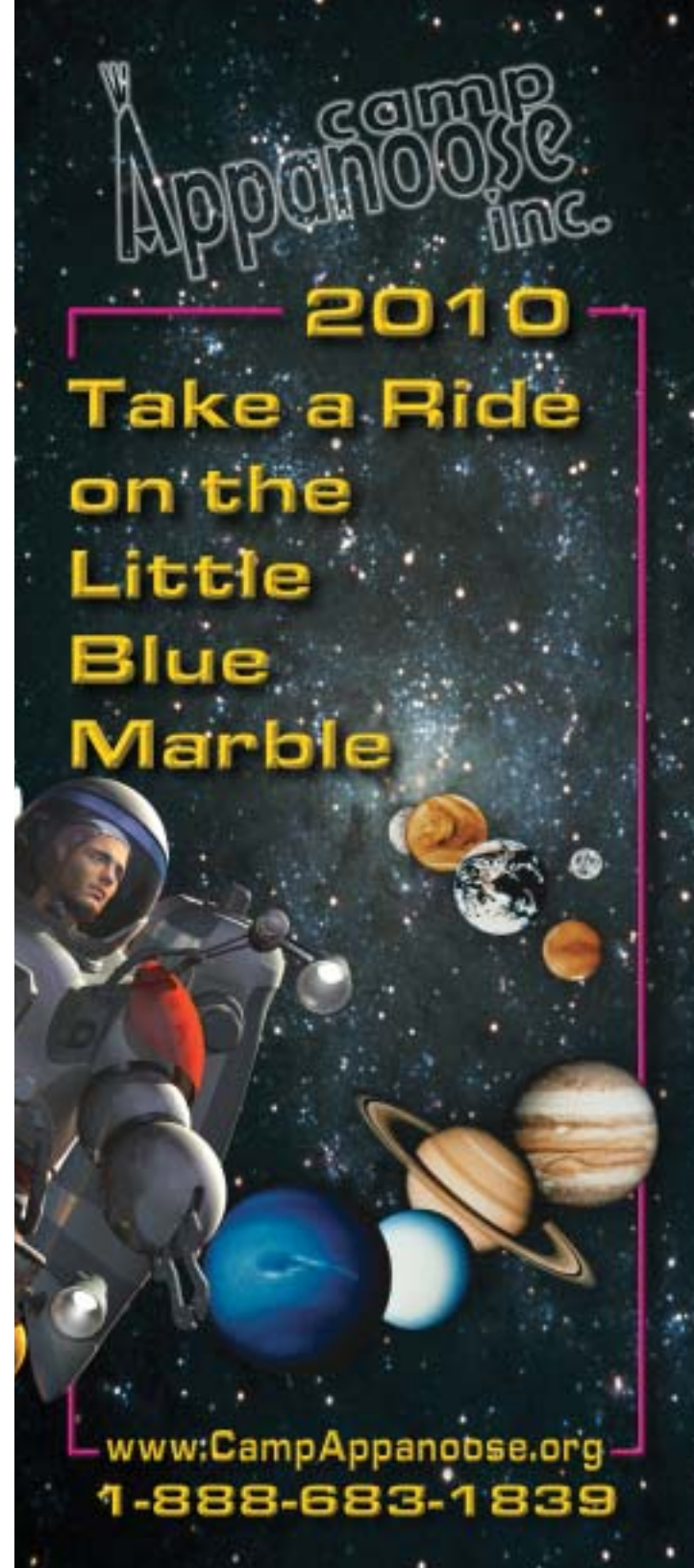
- * **Horse Camp III** – For guys and girls, a great week of riding and gaming activities on horses.

Wind-N-Waves

A special week of camping adventures for teens with several different options. Many classic camp experiences with wind and water. Such as a water skiing/tubing, canoeing, and kayaking on Iowa's Ocean. Horses, archery, hayrack rides and group competition are among the activities offered. You may choose one of the following options or opt for classic camp experiences. All will share some classic camp activities.

Dirt Bikes / Four Wheelers

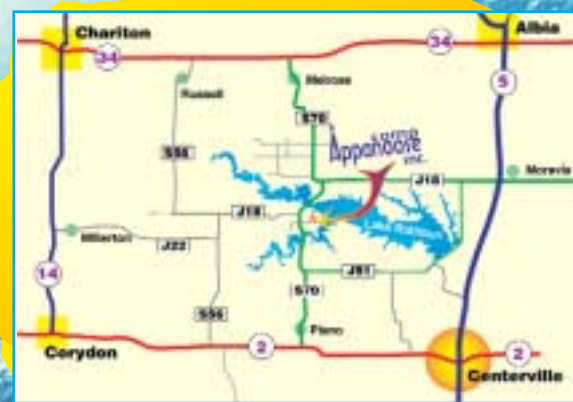
For guys and girls ages 14 and up who love dirt bikes and four wheelers. Lots of trail riding on our Battle Creek and Confidence Gulch Trails. Learn how to make your equipment perform at its peak. Use equipment which is provided by C & C Cycle in Chariton or bring your own four wheeler. Participants will be divided between beginners and advanced riders.

Pre-Season Deer Hunter's Training Camp

Develop your hunting skills under the direction of experienced guides. Limited space, so sign up early. For those who qualify, two fall weekend youth hunts are available with guides (September 17-19, 24-26) for a separate fee.

Iowa Hunter Safety Course

Take your hunter safety course at camp and become qualified to participate in hunting sports in Iowa. You may take the course and participate in the Deer Camp as well, if you choose.



Teen Week III - August 2-11

Rocky High Adventure Camp

A physically challenging camp for guys and girls held in the majestic high country of the Rocky Mountains. Backpacking and wilderness camping at its best. Session begins at Camp Appanoose before traveling to a base camp in the mountains. A conditioning phase will prepare each person for the expedition. This week is not designed for super athletes but for guys and girls who are willing to resist fatigue and accept challenges which will take them to the next level and create great memories. Must be at least thirteen.



Leadership Training Camp (LTC)

June 6-12

Experience camp from a different perspective. LTC camp is designed to be an intensive course in spiritual leadership for college students as well as juniors and seniors in high school. LTC also prepares staff and potential staff for a summer of service at camp. Training includes:

- * Recreational leadership and outdoor skills.
- * Bible study techniques.
- * First aid and safety procedures.
- * Group leadership and development.
- * Seminars in a Biblical world perspective.
- * Service projects at camp.
